

COLLEGE ATHLETICS

A few high school athletes are fortunate enough to have the opportunity to continue athletic competition on the inter-collegiate level. In order to qualify for athletic scholarships and the chance to compete, student/athletics must meet the minimum standards as outlined by the N.C.A.A. These standards apply to all entering freshmen in N.C.A.A. Division I or Division II Schools (Division III Schools do not have initial eligibility requirements).

AS A HIGH SCHOOL STUDENT, YOU SHOULD:

1. Make sure that your classes meet the Core Course Requirements.
2. Register with the N.C.A.A. Clearinghouse and have your ACT or SAT Test scores sent to the clearinghouse.
3. Meet with your guidance counselor to review your progress in meeting the minimum standards.
