

## DUAL ENROLLMENT

Juniors (with at least 11 credits) and seniors (with at least 17 credits) are allowed to attend courses at local colleges or universities, both public and private, in addition to or in place of their own high school classes. Students may receive college credit as well as high school credit for these courses. This program is known as "dual enrollment." In order to qualify, students must perform to certain levels on the High School MEAP Test. In order to qualify for the fall of any year, students must take the test prior to enrollment. Sophomores must take the test early in order to qualify for the program in the fall of their junior year, **and must have a letter on file from their parent/guardian stating their intention to dual enroll prior to taking the test.** Seniors must take the test early in order to qualify for the program in the fall of their senior year. **It also should be noted that the National Collegiate Athletic Association (NCAA) requires that all core courses used for collegiate athletic eligibility be calculated into the student's grade point average. This may affect college athletic eligibility.** Students interested in participating in this program should see their counselor for complete details.
